IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR Camp Howard Family Camp 2010

Thank you for choosing **CYO/Camp Howard** Family Camp as a camping option this year for your summer family vacation plans.

Registration:

All children under the age of 18 must be accompanied by a registered, paying adult. Full payment is required before attending camp.

Directions to Camp Howard:

From Portland take I-84, East towards the Dalles. Take exit 18 (Lewis and Clark State Park) and head south. Turn left onto the Old Columbia Hwy, heading towards Springdale and Corbett. At Springdale stay to the right on Hurlburt Rd, and continue on Hurlburt Rd. until you reach the flashing red light. Turn right on Gordon Creek Rd. When you see the sign (on your left), for Trout Creek Bible Camp, you will be 5 miles from Warriner Rd. When Gordon Creek Rd. makes a sharp right hand turn 915 mph sign), turn left onto Warriner Rd. and proceed 1 mile. Turn right at the big "Camp Howard" sign and go .2 miles down the gravel road. The camp is on the left.

Emergency Information:

In case of emergency and someone needs to contact you or a family member, please call the Portland office (503)-231-9484, during our office hours, which are M-F, 9:00am – 5:00pm, or at Camp (503) 695-2972 and you will be helped with your situation.

Medical Information:

All adults will be in charge of their own child's medication. CYO/Camp Howard will not be responsible.

Safety:

The safety and well being of the campers is our top priority. We have a Health Supervisor on staff 24 hours a day.

Lost and Found:

Camp Howard is not responsible for any items that are left while at Camp Howard. All lost and found items are returned to the Portland office and donated to charity after two weeks. Please come to our Portland office to look for your lost belongings.

Behavior Expectations:

CYO/Camp Howard strives to provide a safe Christian community for all campers. Campers that are unwilling to follow the basic camp rules make it difficult for staff to provide this environment for all campers. It is unacceptable for one camper to ruin the experience of other campers. We will make every effort to work with your child, but if other children are being affected, or if their behavior is putting them or others at risk, then we will send the child home with no refund. Below is the code of conduct for Camp Howard:

1. Respect yourself
2. Respect others

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3. Respect the environment
4. Respect the property of CYO/Camp Howard
5. Follow directions
6. Use proper language
7. Discrimination and intimidation will not be tolerated
8. Malicious teasing of another person is unacceptable
9. There is no place at camp for alcohol, drugs or fireworks.

What to wear: The weather in Oregon is pretty unpredictable. If we say rain it will shine. If we say sunshine it will rain. Be prepared for both!

What to bring: You will need to bring your own sleeping bags, towels, washcloths, pillows, etc. Camp Howard cabins include bunks and mattresses. FYI: Following is a list of items that we normally suggest children bring to general camp. The following list is recommended, not required (depending on your needs).

- Deodorant/Soap
- Insect repellent
- Towels (1 pool and 1 shower)
- Toothbrush and toothpaste
- Hairbrush
- Shampoo/conditioner

Miscellaneous

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What NOT to bring: Dogs are not permitted. The following list is recommended, not required (depending on your needs). The following is a list of items we tell children who go to Camp Howard not to bring with them. CYO/Camp Howard will not be responsible for these items should they be broken, stolen, or lost.
